ITEM NO.1: TO APPROVE AND ADOPT THE MINUTES OF THE 39TH MEETING OF THE GOVERNING COUNCIL.

- **Mr. S. Rammohan also advised that continuous follow-up was needed to ensure students performed well in mathematics, as he had observed that it was a contributing factor to decreased academic performance. The Member Secretary informed him that remedial measures were being taken.**

ITEM NO.2: REPORT ON ACADEMIC AND OTHER RELATED ACTIVITIES.

The following points were discussed:

40.01. ACTIVITIES PERTAINING TO AUTONOMY

Member Secretary presented the following information on activities under autonomy.

a) Extension of Autonomy

The first cycle of Autonomy ended in the month of June 2022. A Committee from Anna University conducted an inspection on 30th June, 2022 for scrutiny and verification of the application for renewal of autonomous status. UGC vide letter No.F.2-10/2023 (AC- Policy) dated 31st May, 2023 conferred extension of autonomous for a period of 10 years from the academic year 2022-2023 to 2031-2032.

b) Board of Studies

The meetings of the Seven Boards of Studies were conducted during the period from 19th September to 30th September 2024 to recommend the following to the Academic Council:

- Proposal of new certificate and value-added courses.
- Revision of vision and mission statements by each department.
- Initiation and identification of industries and universities for Semester in Industry and Semester Abroad programs.
- Introduction of the next regulation, Regulation 2026.

- Change of Chairman for the Board of Studies for the Faculty of Technology.
- Determination of the modalities for conduct and assessment methodologies of H&M Courses.
- Incorporation of experiential learning and mapping of Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs) with laboratory courses under the Computer Science and Information Technology Board.
- Updating of course titles, syllabi, and outcomes wherever required.

c) Academic Council

The Academic Council meeting held on 18th October 2024 approved the following:

1. The recommendations submitted by various Boards of Studies.
2. The academic audit report presented by the Dean, IQAC.
3. Removal of the minimum CGPA requirement at the time of registration for the H&M Scheme under Regulation 22 (R22).
4. Implementation of only two Formative Assessment Tests with equal weightage for courses conducted under the H&M Scheme.
5. Facilitating students who opt for either the Semester Abroad Program (SAP) or the Semester in Industry Program (SIP) to study core courses, left during their stay outside the campus, in the subsequent semester with a guidance of a teacher.
6. Conducting paperless Final Assessment Tests (FAT) alone for VIII semester students in two phases:
 - Phase 1: Delivery of the question paper in soft copy format.
 - Phase 2: Submission of answer sheets in soft copy format.
7. Adoption of Regulation 2026 in principle for both UG and PG students admitted in the academic year 2026–2027 onwards.
8. Appointment of Dr. R. Govindarasu, Head of the Chemical Engineering Department, as a new member, and the appointment of Dr. E. Nakkeeran as the Chairman of the BoS for the Board of Technology.

- *During a discussion of the 5-year data, Mr. Jawahar Vadivelu observed a dip in Research and Professional Practice (RP) and Outreach and Inclusivity (OI), which was a matter of concern.*
- *Mr. Rammohan added that the weightage for research is high in all accreditation processes; therefore, the contributing factors should be identified and studied.*
- *The Member Secretary informed the council that steps were being taken and requested input from others.*
- *Prof. Murugavel stated that faculty members had recently been asked to explain their less frequent contributions to research and publications and many Professors mentioned administrative work as a significant time constraint.*
- *Dr. K.R. Santha added that there was a correlation between all these factors.*
- *Regarding improvement in the citations for journals, it was discussed that the Supervisor have to inform the research scholars to carry out their work in relevant areas.*
- *The Member Secretary stated that an increase in the number of research scholars would lead to an increase in publications. He also noted that a few Professors who had been publishing journal articles had left the institution.*




- **Dr. Hosimin Thilagar stated that teachers could not be forced to engage in research. Instead, the college needed to create an environment conducive to research. In addition to incentives, financial assistance could be provided for procuring equipment or software for undergraduate and postgraduate student projects to motivate them to develop prototypes.**
- **The Member Secretary informed the committee that similar suggestions had been given by the IQAC audit team. He further added that the Management was encouraging research by providing Rs.100,000/- as intramural research grants for five teachers per year and Rs.10,000/- each for 20 UG projects and 10 PG projects.**

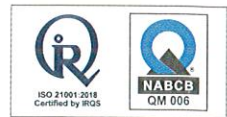

With reference to IQAC activities, Member Secretary presented the following details to the council.

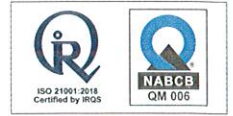

- The campaign's review was conducted by Shri. M.G. Murali, a 5S consultant, on September 26, 2024. The review outcomes categorized items as E-Waste, Mechanical, Electrical, Electronics, Glass, and Wooden items.
- SVCE team, comprising Dr. S. Gopinath, Dean-IQAC received the Gold Award in the KAIZEN (Continuous Improvement) Competition organized by the Quality Circle Forum of India (QCFI), Chennai Chapter, on November 16, 2024.

BIS Activities

- Organized BIS National Seminar on "Enhancing Building Durability: Waterproofing, Damp-Proofing, and Construction Chemicals" was coordinated by SVCE on 22nd July 2024.

40.10. RESEARCH CENTERS

Member Secretary informed the council that eleven departments in our college are recognized as Research Centers to conduct Research Programs. 201 scholars are pursuing PhD in the Research Centres out of which 39 are full-time scholars and 162 part-time scholars. Out of the 162 part-time scholars, 57 scholars are SVCE faculty. He also informed that 31 SVCE faculty members are pursuing PhD in other research centres.

He also informed that out of the 201 scholars pursuing Ph.D. program in our Research Centres, 32 are doing course work, 144 scholars had completed their course work and 25 scholars had submitted synopsis.

40.11. STUDENT STRENGTH

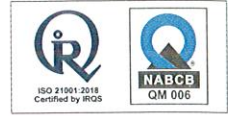

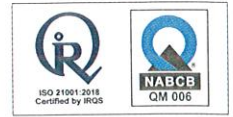
